

## “Pray always”

Jesus tells us in today’s Gospel to “pray always.”  
Two questions can come from this command which Jesus asks of us.

- Why is prayer so important?
- And what does it mean to “pray always?”

Prayer is absolutely essential to our relationship with God because it is how we communicate with God. As with any relationship, communication is the essence of our relationship with that person. The same is true of our relationship with God. God constantly calls to us. Prayer is how we communicate with Him; how we speak with Him, how we listen to Him. Since prayer is how we communicate with God it is the essence of our relationship with Him. Another way of saying this is that prayer IS our relationship with God. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, CCC, 2558) Clearly then, prayer is one of the most important things that we will ever do. If our hearts and minds are open to what God says to us in prayer, then that changes everything. Prayer enables us to truly “see.” Prayer enables us to truly “hear.” It enables us to truly come to “understand.” To see, hear, and understand what? Prayer enables us to “see” things that we otherwise wouldn’t see without the clarity which is provided to us by God through prayer. He whispers to us in silence, in our hearts and minds. Silent whispers of perfect love and mercy that lift us up. He reveals to us things about ourselves that we would otherwise never recognize or understand. He reveals to us what we are supposed to do, and what this life is all about. The more we pray, the clearer things become. One of the most important things we come to realize is how powerful His love is for us, and that it is beyond our comprehension. It is overwhelming how much we are loved by Him, and how so exceedingly good He has been to us. Prayer draws us closer to Him, and pulls our heart toward Him more and more, with an increased longing for an even greater closeness. Like Psalm 63 says: “O God, you are my God – for you I long! For you my body yearns; for you my soul thirsts, like a land parched, lifeless, without water....For your love is better than life, my lips offer you worship!” As our prayer life grows so does a greater and greater awareness of how fortunate we are to be His beloved sons and daughters, and how much He wants us with Him. With that increased awareness comes a profound and overwhelming sense of gratitude. As our internal prayer life strengthens, we come to see more and more clearly what this life is all about – which is to be with Him forever in heaven with His perfect love and joy and peace, AND to experience His Presence during this life here as much as we possibly can. Prayer then sustains us throughout our lives, through the good and the bad, the ups and the downs. For we know in the back of our minds why we are here, and what this life means. Prayer provides a great awakening.

To “pray always” then means to continually be in communication with God, and therefore continually be in relationship with Him. This of course can be with our lips and our profession of faith, but is so often through our hearts and minds. We do this when we commit ourselves to a devoted relationship with our Lord. If we are in a committed loving relationship with a person here on earth, then our thoughts, our words, and our actions reflect that, as do our emotions and our impulses. If we are married, for example, then we will act in such a way that we will honor that relationship. This includes how we spend our time, and with whom we spend our time. We are not just married when we are speaking with that person or in their direct company. Our relationship with our spouse directs everything that we do as it pertains to our bond with them. Our choices and our behavior communicates to our spouse the status of our relationship with them. Similarly, if we are a father or a mother, then we will act in a way that reflects our being in a relationship with our children, so as to care for them and nurture them and love them. We are not just a mother or a father only when we are speaking with our children or listening to them or in their physical presence.





When a person is in a relationship with someone it affects everything about them and their existence, even if they engage in other activities which do not directly involve that other person (like a parent who goes off to work as a dentist or a plumber yet always remains a father or mother to their child). Our daily choices and our behavior communicates to our children the status of our relationship with them. The same could be said about siblings, or a child to a parent, with each type of relationship involving responsibilities and behavior essential to those relationships. The choices and behavior of those siblings and children communicates to their other siblings or their parents the status of their relationship with them. It is like that with God, but to a much higher level. Since prayer is the essence of our relationship with God, then what we do, what we say, what we think, what we allow ourselves to watch, what we allow ourselves to listen to, and how we allow ourselves to act, all communicates to God what He means to us, and how important our relationship is to Him. We live a life consistent with our relationship with Him. Meaning that everything we do and are - our thoughts, words, actions, choices, etc. - all reflect our love and commitment to God our Father in heaven, AND it communicates to our Father the nature and status of our relationship with Him. Praying traditional prayers like the Our Father is of course one way we communicate that. Sitting in silence in adoration is one of the very best ways to be in communication with Him and conveys to Him how much we love Him, and how grateful we are to Him. Participating in the Liturgy of the Eucharist is another form of prayer and is actually the very pinnacle of prayer. However, everything about ourselves is a reflection of our relationship with God and communicates to God how much we love Him, how much we appreciate Him, and how we seek Him in our lives. So when we decide to choose good and avoid temptation by reflecting on our relationship with God and our love for Him then we are using our hearts and minds and "praying" through that very choice. Yes, traditional prayers, novenas, adoration, and Mass are all conduct where we "pray always," but we also "pray always" by constantly being mindful of our connection with God and our relationship with Him so that everything about us reflects that and thereby communicates to God His importance in our life.

Our faith should always be in the back of our mind, and in the front of our hearts, integrated into everything we think, everything we say, and everything we do, so that by living the life God calls us to live we are "praying always." Our very lives should be a fusion of our activity & our faith. Our hearts and minds should be "hardwired," permanently connected, to our faith so that everything is a reflection of our loving relationship with God. St. John Chrysostom said: "It is possible to offer fervent prayer even while walking in public or strolling alone, or seated in your shop, ...while buying or selling, ...or even while cooking." Prayer and the Christian life are inseparable. (CCC 2745) "He 'prays without ceasing' who unites prayer to works and good works to prayer." (CCC 2745) When we constantly seek the Lord and His will, and we fully integrate our lives with our faith in a natural, habitual way out of love, commitment, and mindfulness, then will be doing what Jesus asks of us when He says: "pray always."
