## Staff Reflection

Our Gospel on this First Sunday of Lent is divided into two parts. The first tells us that Jesus chooses to fast and pray for 40 days in the desert. He chooses, by His own volition, to deny Himself in order to prepare for His life of ministry. As the Son of God, He had no need to prepare; nevertheless, He allows Himself to feel the dryness of a parched throat, the ache of an empty stomach, and the desolation that comes with true loneliness.

The second part of our Gospel allows us to hear the words that Jesus speaks following His experience in the desert. We get three sentences from Him: “This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel.”

This short Gospel provides us with a roadmap for Lent. As we journey to Easter, Jesus has modeled exactly what to do. First, we must allow ourselves to go out into the desert. Though we may be blessed with plenty of food to eat, clean water to drink, and members of our community to fill our days, we must find small ways to go without. We have to feel the dryness of a parched throat, the ache of an empty stomach, and the desolation that comes with true loneliness, just like Jesus showed us. Why, you may ask? Because of what Jesus says upon His return. He gives us three sentences to send us on our Lenten journey.

“This is the time of fulfillment”: Now is the time. Doesn’t matter if it is inconvenient. The time is now to turn to God.

“The kingdom of God is at hand”: This is the place. Even if the world seems imperfect, this is where we are called to build the kingdom of God by loving one another.

“Repent and believe in the gospel”: Rethink everything you know. Rethink what the world is teaching you. Allow yourself to be changed by my merciful love.

Lent can be overwhelming. 40 days of preparation is a long time, and it is very normal to “lose steam” with our Lenten promises as we move toward Easter. However, our Gospel today is truly good news. Jesus modeled for us how to “do” Lent correctly. He shows us that we need to go out into our own deserts and deny ourselves to remind us that only God can fulfill our needs. Then we need to truly repent and live like we believe in the Gospel. Join me in turning towards the example Jesus has set for us this Lent. You are in my prayers.

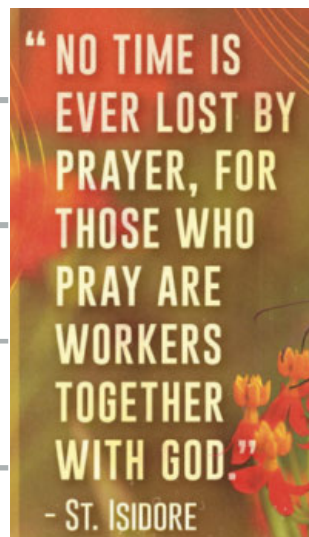
