

Staff Reflection

If we imagined that Jesus would gently enter into his public ministry with something non-confrontational to please the crowds and, hopefully, to start to win the favor of the authorities, we will be disappointed by the course of action He takes in today's Gospel. With the zeal of a Son who sees his Father's house desecrated, Jesus cleanses the temple during a Passover feast, driving out the animals and the merchants who have trespassed to take up residence there for their own profit.

The tables of the moneychangers and the sellers of animals had become such a production that they were crowding out the people who had come for worship. The enterprise had become so chaotic and crowded that in a very literal sense, it was separating the people from worshiping God. Jesus comes in and drives out what has gotten in the way. He pours out the money, he drives out the sellers, he overturns the tables, and he angers the religious leaders. And, again, his disciples are impressed. But what Jesus is after is deep, lasting change. What Jesus is after is repentance. What Jesus is after is making space for what is holy – for him and his Father.

And that is change only God can bring about. It is not about getting our lives cleaned up before coming into God's presence. It is about opening the door and inviting Jesus in so we can see what Jesus does, because Jesus is the one overturning the tables in our hearts and lives and making the holy mess we need so that we can make space for God.

I am using the Hallow app this Lenten Season and participating in the 40 Days of Lent Challenge. The focus is the life of Fr. Walter Ciszek and his book *He Leadeth Me*. So far the emphasis has been on surrendering to God and asking God to show us His will. Jesus is asking us during this Lenten Season to make space for him, to surrender to him and to overturn what has gotten in the way of loving him, others and ourselves. Jesus, I surrender myself to you.



Explanation of the O.C.I.A. (formerly RCIA) Rites during Lent

The OCIA, which is an acronym for Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, is the process whereby adults prepare to receive the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil Mass. These adults meet over many months to pray and learn of the teachings of the Catholic Church and the Sacraments. In Catholic parishes all over the world, all new adult

members of the Church are received into the Catholic faith at the solemn Easter Vigil liturgy with the reception of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. These three sacraments are referred to as the Sacraments of Initiation.

Those going through the OCIA process, or faith journey, are either Catechumens or Candidates. Catechumens have never been baptized, and therefore, would be receiving all three of the Initiation Sacraments. Candidates have already been baptized, either in another Christian faith or Catholic. We recognize one Baptism, so if someone is validly baptized a Christian in a Protestant church, we recognize that baptism. They would not need to be re-baptized as a Catholic. In that case, they would make a Profession of Faith in the beliefs and teachings of the Roman Catholic Church, and then be Confirmed and receive Eucharist. A baptized, yet not fully initiated Catholic, would complete their initiation by receiving the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist.

On the 1st Sunday of Lent, all catechumens are presented to the Bishop of their diocese, and they are "elected" by the Bishop to receive the Easter Sacraments. From that point on they are referred to as "the elect." Throughout Lent, the elect celebrate rites known as the "scrutinies" on the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays of Lent. You will see these rites taking place at various masses on these Sundays. These rites are meant to call the elect, and all of us present, to pray for deeper

conversion and turning from sin, as they draw closer to Easter. At these masses, when the elect are present, the readings at that mass are changed to reflect the themes of life-giving water, light and sight and new life, which point them to their baptism at Easter. Our parish will be celebrating these scrutiny rites at the 5:00 vigil mass on March 2nd; the 9:30 mass on March 10th; and the 11:30 mass on March 17th.
